Survey Background:

- A sub-committee comprised of members of the Distance Education Committee and Integrated Planning Committee developed a survey designed to probe students' reasons for withdrawing from online coursework.
- The survey was launched Spring 2012 and is administered to students each semester since that time. The results presented below include responses from students withdrawing during the Spring 2016 term.
- All students who utilize WebSMART to withdraw from courses are immediately invited to participate in a survey indicating their reasons for withdrawal. Survey participation is voluntary.
- •Only students withdrawing during the official withdrawal period, where a 'W' grade is recorded on the student's academic record, are surveyed.
