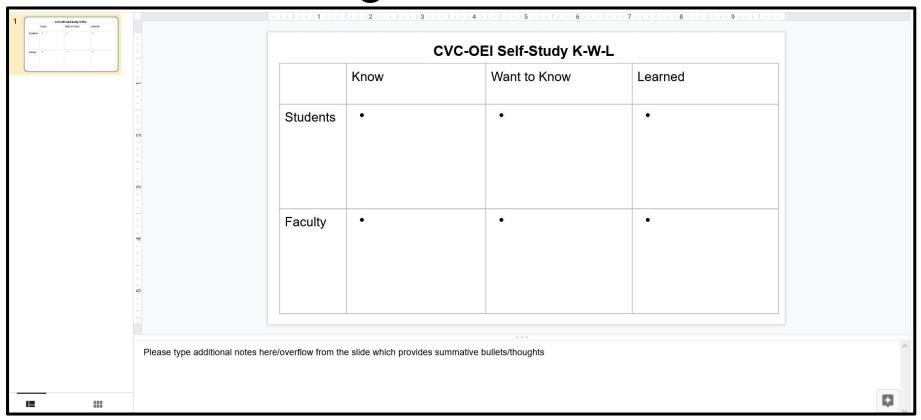

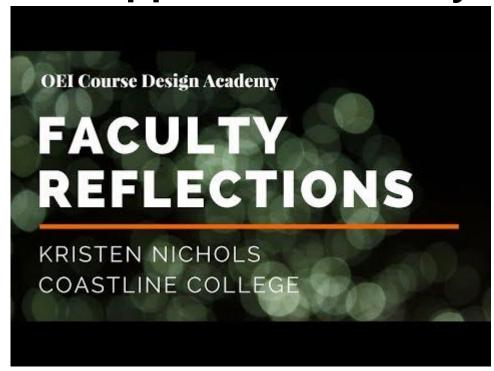

ID Fall 2020 Needs Assessment Report

- Needs Assessment conducted August-November 2020 (provided at Division presentations, Academic Senate, and posted as Canvas Announcement)
- Most respondents were Adjunct Faculty (50%) and from Business Technology
 Division (47%)
- The needs identified were varied and diverse:
 - Inclusive and Accessible Course Design
 - Student Engagement Strategies
 - Revising course design for course alignment with District commitment to social justice and equity
- There is ongoing need for faculty training and support with technology tools and pedagogy

- Integrations with student planning and calibration with functioning as independent scholars

- Being members of consortium will permit us to contribute in ways that we value





Threats

What are some dangers, what are others doing, or what threats do our weaknesses expose to us

- The place where we are leads us to assume that access to technology and study space are ubiquitous when it is not. How can we support students?
- Faculty have been asked to remove distance learning assignments (diminish rigor of course)
 - Instead why not fund student resources?
- Adjunct faculty need access to the resources
