 - Review Program reviews
 - Oversight, make recommendations re: policy to executive leadership
 - The committee of all committees
- 2. What do you feel your role is on IPC as constituency representatives?
 - Sharing from my constituency and gathering important information that may be relevant to my work
 - Bring concerns from senate and faculty
 - Sharing out info (IPC \rightarrow Areas and Areas \rightarrow IPC)
 - Encourage faculty to at least listen in to IPC
 - As a channel to bring questions/concerns to IPC
 - As a channel to communicate concerns or opportunities to the president (and the chancellor)
 - Share perspective from our areas and how issues, plans etc. that are presented here in IPC could affect students we serve and our work
 - Report to IPC (greater campus community) what my committees are working on
 - Get input on professional development planning; ensuring college PD aligns with institutional priorities

 - Enacting and reviewing college priorities

 - Specific deep dives
 - Break in the middle

- More action items
- Campus goal setting
- Shifting locations
- Small group work and interactive activities, polls, breakouts
- Icebreakers/Mix & mingle time
- Identify things IPC is responsible for (to create, approve, update, have ownership of)
- Actionable outcomes review
- Decide as a group who we want to hear from @ least once/meeting
- Interactive and reflective activities (like this one) is good for individual participation and group share
- We need a method to send in anonymous questions. I'm sure some feel unable to submit probing questions or differing opinions while their superiors are also in the mtg.
- Have a regular agenda item when someone from program/service presents. Schedule those out for the year so folks know in advance. Educational and breaks down silos
- Maintain hybrid accessibility (zoom)
- Another option to surface more differences of opinion, maybe 15 minutes set aside for public comment?
- Scheduling survey
- Include upcoming discussion topics in collegewide Announcements
- Academic and Classified Senates as mechanisms to communicate to constituencies upcoming agenda items

 - Make sure the materials, agenda, recordings are posted ASAP

- Share meeting summery, video snippets/summary with campus
- Strategic communication/layer communication
- An email sent out to all CSM with a meeting agenda beforehand and minutes after
- Zoom link in the outlook invite
- Consistent schedule of meetings
- Share in announcements short list of agenda items? /Too much in announcements already
