1. Robert's Rules of Order

Monique reported her research on other colleges' center assessment methods and data. Their center PRs focused more on assessment of services, such as provisions of services, e.g. training of tutors. Their PRs focused less on students' grades. Monique believed that experimental models were not the best methods in generating center data because of the difficulties of using control groups. The goal is to search for more meaningful /useful data.

English faculty Kathleen argued that it is meaningful to focus on learning outcomes in center assessment and data collection.
