## **Big 5 Safety Protocols: Enhancing Campus Safety and Preparedness**

The SMCCCD is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all students, faculty, staff, and visitors. In line with our dedication to creating a secure campus environment, we have adopted the **Big 5 Safety Protocols**, which are designed to guide our community in responding effectively to potential emergencies. These protocols are integral to maintaining a safe and well-prepared campus environment:

- 1. **Lockdown Barricade**: In the event of an imminent threat, such as an active shooter or other violent incident, the priority is to immediately secure all individuals inside classrooms, offices, and other enclosed spaces. Lock and barricade doors, close blinds, turn off lights, and remain out of sight until law enforcement gives the all-clear. This protocol helps mitigate the danger of exposure to a potential threat.
- 2. **Secure Campus**: When there is a threat in the surrounding area but not directly on campus, we will implement a Secure Campus protocol. All buildings will be locked, and individuals will be instructed to remain indoors. This ensures that the campus remains protected while monitoring the situation. Regular updates will be provided as more information becomes available.
- 3. **Evacuation**: In certain emergency situations, remaining on campus may no longer be safe. The Evacuation protocol outlines the procedures for a coordinated and orderly departure from campus buildings. Students, staff, and faculty will follow designated evacuation routes and gather at predetermined assembly points. Evacuation plans are practiced regularly to ensure a swift and efficient response in the event of an emergency.
- 4. **Shelter in Place**: In cases of natural disasters, hazardous materials incidents, or other environmental threats, the Shelter in Place protocol is activated. Individuals will be instructed to remain indoors, avoid exposure to outdoor conditions, and secure windows and doors. This protocol is designed to protect the campus community from potential dangers while authorities provide further guidance.
- 5. **Drop, Cover, and Hold On**: In the event of an earthquake or significant seismic activity, it is crucial to take immediate protective actions. The Drop, Cover, and Hold On protocol instructs individuals to drop to the ground, seek shelter under sturdy furniture or walls, and hold on until the shaking stops. This simple but effective measure significantly reduces the risk of injury during seismic events.

These **Big 5 Safety Protocols** are fundamental to our campus emergency preparedness efforts. We strongly encourage everyone to familiarize themselves with these protocols and participate in drills to ensure that, in the event of an emergency, we can act swiftly and effectively to protect our community.
