The Umoja Community supports the whole student and as a result, Umoja students are twice as likely to graduate as their non-Umoja counterparts. Umoja graduates have also transferred to a wide range of UCs, CSUs, HBCUs, and private universities.

Intern internationally from home this fall to complete a team project for a company in Australia, Canada, England, India, Japan, South Africa, or the U.S. (New York or San Francisco). Internships run from September 13 – December 3, 2021.

<u>Apply here</u> by Thursday, May 27, 2021 to be considered for the Fall Global Virtual Team Internship Program and its accompanying scholarship\*.

\*The final deadline to apply for the Fall program is Thursday June 3, but students must apply by May 27 to be eligible for the program scholarship.

What's the benefit of participating in a global team-based internship online? The world of work is changing. Gain exposure to and proficiency within a remote workplace, experience working with a global team, expand your knowledge of an industry, further your understanding of global culture, and make international connections. Exact internships are determined through a placement process, but students may be matched with companies in various industries, including Business and Economics, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Marketing and PR, Policy and Government, Public Health and Education, Sustainability and Environment, Technology, and more.

### FCC Launches Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Federal Communications Commission has launched a temporary program to help families and households struggling to afford Internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Broadband Benefit provides a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers.



Eligible households can enroll through a <u>participating broadband provider</u> or directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) using an <u>online</u> or mail in application.

## INSPIRATION OF THE WEEK: MELE K. LATU

Mele is a long-term East Palo Alto resident and community advocate, of Tongan and Fijian descent. She was involved in local programs like the East Palo Alto Junior Golf **Program and College Track. She** began her work with One East Palo Alto, initially serving as a mentor to system-impacted youth for three summers during her college tenure. After graduating from university, she took a gap year and expanded her community engagement internationally to places including the Philippines, China, Australia, Aotearoa (New Zealand), and Tonga. Soon after receiving a call from her mentor Dr. Faye McNair-Knox she returned to take the position as the **Program Coordinator for the Behavioral Health Advisory Group** Ambassador Team/BHAGAT. After 4.5 years of mental health advocacy work, she transitioned to Emerson Collective, a social justice organization serving on the East Palo Alto Team as the Manager of **Community Collaborations.**

In December 2020, she was appointed to the Ravenswood City School District Governing Board and serves as the Board President making her the first Pacific Islander and youngest woman in this district to fill this position. Mele also sits on the 'Anamatangi Polynesian Voices Board, Co-Chairs the East Palo Alto Climate Change Team, and serves on the San Mateo County School Boards Association, Board of Directors.

Mele is revered in the community as a force of faith pushing forward initiatives that continue to support equity and inclusion work, centering the voices of Pacific Islander voices and beyond. May 2021

# THE FANANGA LITERACY PROJECT

The Fananga Literacy Project began in 2019 in partnership with the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) funded by the San Francisco Foundation to combat the literacy challenges the Pacific Islander community faces. The Fananga program is a support program that has been developed to help Pacific Islander students for OUSD Elementary School K-5 Pacific Islander students improve literacy and comprehension scores. This project delivers culturally relevant books, content, and events to raise awareness about Pacific Islander stories, culture, and history.
